The synagogue is G-d's house. Halacha (Jewish law) requires that it be treated with great respect, and places various restrictions on when and how one may talk there.

What should you do if someone speaks to you when talking is not allowed? It is suggested that your response be to move your finger back and forth near the top lines on this page. Or, you might put one finger to your lips and smile.
